Improvements in the College Information Communications Technology Resources

Many parents will already be aware that Lavalla was successful in 2008 in obtaining a grant of \$348,000 from the Australian Government for Round 1 of the National Secondary School Computer Fund.

The College was able to purchase 351 computers with this grant money to bring our total fleet to just over 670 computers for student and staff use. Our technical staff worked hard prior to the Christmas break last year to get these ready for student use. We have installed Office 2007 and the Adobe Master Suite on the computers capable of running these. In addition to these, the College is in the process of renewing the servers that manage and administer all the computers on the College network.

The College is seeking additional funding from the Australian Government to assist with the infrastructure costs in setting up the new servers to cope with the additions we have made to our computer fleet. Parents may be interested to know that the software needed to just run the servers and keep our students and staff safe from SPAM, unsavoury websites and amateur hackers costs the College an average of \$45,000 a year.

Work is also being carried out on the College wireless network to facilitate access to the College computer resources from most of the learning spaces. Most of the new computers purchased last year are laptops capable of wireless connections. This allows students to use them without having to be connected to power or to a wired network connection and also allows classrooms to be set-up in the ways that facilitate learning without being bound to fixed furniture. As wireless networks do drop out from time to time, we have asked all computer users to carry a USB memory stick around with them to save and back-up work.

We have also acquired new devices for photocopying-printing-scanning. These devices will only operate with a College ID card and so both staff and students have been issued with these.

The College is in the process of developing a new look to the College website and we hope to launch this at the start of term 2 this year.
