From the Principal

Dear Parents and Students

This year we acknowledge 200 years of the Brigidine tradition in Victoria and almost 50 years in Traralgon when the Brigidine sisters founded St Michael's Primary school in 1958. Daniel Delaney, Bishop of Kildare established the Congregation of the Sisters of St Brigid (Brigidine Sisters) in Ireland in 1807. Not unlike Marcellin Champagnat, Bishop Delaney was spurred to form a religious teaching order in response to the need of the time. Of their own History the Brigidine Sisters write that, "In the shadow of the penal days in Ireland the need for education and revitalising the faith was stark". Bishop Delaney sought the patronage of Our Lady and the patroness of Ireland, St Brigid to protect and guide the first women who began the work of providing a secular and religious education programme for rich and poor alike.

The Oak tree which has come to symbolise the growth of the Brigidine congregation has become central to the life of the Kildare Campus. It is a place where students meet in the morning and in their rest times and in its shade we recognise the sacred place that repairs us from the harshness of our summer sun. The Oak is both strong and gentle and is in keeping with the spirit of St Brigid and the Brigidine motto - "Fortiter et Suaviter" – "with strength and gentleness".

Bishop Delaney planted a sapling from the Oak tree at Brigid's abbey in Kildare as a sign that the work begun by Brigid had sprouted again. Since 1807, the Brigidine sisters have established 95 schools in the United Kingdom, Australia and New Zealand and each of those schools is said to have planted in its grounds the Oak tree as a symbol of the Word of God branching out into all aspects of humanity. The first founding sisters in Victoria began their work in Echuca in 1886 and in Traralgon in 1958. Sadly, the Sisters withdrew from Traralgon in 1988 but left us the Kildare Campus, the Oak tree and Delany House as legacies of their tradition and presence amongst us. Last week, Sr Rose Duffy returned to the Kildare Campus the original statue of Sr Brigid that lived in the long corridor of Kildare College in the 1960s.

She has been restored and we will celebrate her return in a fitting way some time soon.



Today the Brigidine Sisters are known for their Compassion and Justice for Humanity and the Earth and their current work with Asylum seekers is well known. In 2001, they responded to the signs of the time and Brigidine House became open to accommodate and support Asylum seekers. The theme for Lavalla Catholic College this year is 'Looking to the Future with Audacity and Hope'.
