Monday 15<sup>th</sup> is an important celebration time in the life of the Church. The tradition we celebrate is called the Assumption of Mary and is actually a public holiday in places like France, Italy and Philippines and it is celebrated properly at the College. We need to recognize its importance in our calendar and try to understand its meaning.

This feast is a long tradition that goes back many centuries in the Church both of the East and West. The Assumption of Mary, the mother of Jesus, celebrates the fullness of Mary's life in union with God. It is a celebration which opens up for us the realization of what God's love can create in our lives and reminds us of the hope which comes to us from this event.

Just as the blossoms, which are appearing during this wet and chilly winter, are a happy reminder that Spring is soon to come, so too does our celebration of Mary's fullness of life with God give us hope in God's presence in our lives and a promise of what is to come for us.

**Intention Forms** for all Years 7, 8 and 9 students were handed out on Monday. Please attend to these and return them by the due date.

We have introduced a **Mobile Phone Agreement Form**. If you son or daughter has a phone at school you are asked to complete this form. Copies have been sent home. 30 have been returned to date.

**Uniform** is being worn well by the majority of students. It is a requirement of the College that all students wear the correct items of uniform and adhere to our jewellery expectations. Hopefully the excuses of: 'it's in the wash', 'couldn't find it', 'I didn't know that', 'I thought it was PE' will be a thing of the past.

**Snow trips** have been postponed again due to the lack of snow. The next possible dates are 24<sup>th</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup> August.

Our Year 7's went to **Starlab** this week as part of their Science Program. The presentation focused on the Earth's Travel in Space, Stars in the Night Sky and the Columbia Expedition. We congratulate students on their behaviour and response to this activity.

Last week **Year 7 students participated in the Achievement Improvement Monitor (AIM)** which is a statewide assessment and reporting program in English and Maths. In recent years, Australian governments have resolved to see that student literacy and numeracy levels of skill are raised and the AIM is part of this move. But a test alone cannot bring about improvements, just as measuring yourself will not make you grow taller.

Used well, the AIM results can contribute to improving learning outcomes by providing information that is a **part** (only) of a total learning picture.

Used on their own the results do not give a complete indication of any child's abilities in Maths and English - it must be kept in mind that the tests indicate what each child can do on a particular day with a particular set of requirements under a particular set of circumstances. However, used in conjunction with a whole program of assessments, AIM results can provide very useful information.

Therefore, governments and education systems can use the results to get a broad idea of numeracy and literacy standards, teachers can use them as an instrument of comparison with other assessments and parents can check results against reports received from schools. With a comprehensive collection of assessment results that includes the AIM, schools can appropriately adjust their curriculum to meet the learning needs of their students, paving the way for skills improvement. This is very much what occurs at our college.

### **Motivational Speaker**

Last Thursday, **Tom Hafey**, former VFL/AFL Coach came to speak with the Year 12 students. His energetic message was simply about “having a go” at all things in life. His formula for success: **Desire + Dedication + Determination + Discipline = Destiny**. Tom is a strong advocate for not using drugs of any kind, has never smoked, consumed alcohol or used any illicit drugs himself and at the age of 74 still pursues a daily fitness regime of running 10 kilometres, swimming in the Bay, 200 push ups, 600 crunches and gymnasium work that would leave many men forty years his junior gasping for breath.

He was inspirational and many students have commented on this. In closing the gathering, I encouraged all students, that since the mid-year exams were finished, Unit 3 was completed and that Unit 4 had

well and truly begun, it was time to refocus, for some to get back on track, to revisit goals and to continue with the work of pursuing dreams for the future. For some, this will mean that they might need to set new goals, for others, to begin to understand the importance of a good finish to the year, and for others yet again, to come to the realisation that there are only eight (8) school weeks remaining until the end of classes for Year 12.
