Dear parents and students

It goes against our natural call not to be able to assist those in need but it is now more than 12 days since Cyclone Nargis struck Burma's delta region causing many thousands of deaths, with the number bound to increase due to sequential disease, starvation and exposure to the elements. Yet the Burmese Government continues to conduct business as usual, making no effort to speed up visas for foreign aid agencies desperate to get relief teams, supplies and infrastructure into disaster zones. This lack of action is beyond our comprehension. Taken from an eyewitness account the extract below captures the human tragedy that has unfolded in Burma:

"...I went far off to Phyapon, down the Irrawady river. With bodies of human beings and cattle floating alongside the boat, we reached a destroyed village...with tears in their eyes, women explained how the waves snatched their babes from their breasts. A mighty tidal wave became their grave. The mothers weep.

As our boat moved along, a body of a five-year-old boy drifted across our path. He is the child of a mourning mother somewhere. The boy drifts in unnamed waters, waiting for burial, unwept and unnamed... Decaying debris lies in the waterlogged terrain. Dead animals are spread out near the debris. The people have neither the energy nor the will to bury them. There are many refugees, living in roofless churches and monasteries. Help has not reached them."

Though China has its own earthquake now to deal with, we can only hope that the diplomatic processes with China and the UN General Assembly and Security Council are working furiously behind the scenes to put enough political pressure on the Burmese government so that the ones who are really suffering, the poor and destitute, get humanitarian support.

On the home front

In comparison to the devastation in Burma and in China over recent days, State Government Funding for Catholic schools seems insignificant. Nonetheless, it is a problem that continues to face us, especially now that teachers have been successful in their claim for improved pay and conditions. Attached to this newsletter is a letter addressed to you, highlighting the constraints that we are facing.

A few major points of interest include:

- Catholic schools in Victoria receive about \$578 less per child each year than children being educated in Catholic schools in NSW.
- The Catholic Education Commission of Victoria (CECV) is asking the State Government to fund the Catholic sector an additional \$25.5 million per annum to ensure funding equity for Catholic disadvantaged students and communities. A student with a disability in a Catholic school receives just \$5,000, two thirds of which is funded by recurrent grants. The same student in a government school receives \$15,000. There are 5,500 students with disabilities in Catholic schools.
- The Catholic Education Commission of Victoria (CECV) is asking the State Government to fund Internet provision from \$1.95 million to \$5.9 million per annum to enable needy Catholic schools to have the same bandwidth connection as government schools. The budget showed, however, that the Government had decided not to renew the \$1.95 million previously provided, meaning that the overall State contribution will decline from 30 June 2008.
- There is no provision in 2008/2009 budget for additional recurrent funds to assist schools in matching the recent wage increases agreed to by the Government for State school teachers. Without real increases in State funding, Catholic schools will be forced to make two undesirable choices: reduce resources and programmes or increase school fees.

No doubt you recognise the lack of parity here – not only in the educational resourcing opportunities for your child but also in the lack of responsibility on the government's behalf to your child's education and future. I urge you to contact our political representatives, especially now as the bi-election has been called, and wield some political pressure of your own. Certainly, Principals in Catholic Schools are exploring every avenue possible to ensure the same.
