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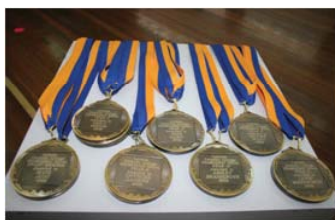
Mrs Lee McKenzie – Acting Principal

St Paul's Campus Campus

There is plenty happening; the Year 8 camps are on; the Champagnat Mass and Festival was held on 28th July on the campus; EXPO is on the 14th. The staff is very busy getting ready for EXPO; subject displays, career pathways, planning information sessions for parents and students, subject selection processes etc are all well underway. In the meantime, it is business as usual.

Champagnat Festival

On Tuesday 28 July, the campus hosted students and staff from the other two campuses, parents and representatives from the **Primary Schools** and the **CEO** at the Champagnat Mass. **Fr. Mark Godridge** was the celebrant. **Br. Doug Walsh**, Principal of the College in the 1980s and a winner of the OAM delivered the opening address.

After the Mass, the students were entertained by a variety of bands who played in the Champagnat Centre, including our own "**Albion**". It was quite unusual to see students from three campuses wandering in and out of the Champagnat Centre, chewing on sausages or burgers from the stand set up by the Lions Club. Of course, the rock bands were a big hit with the students.

At 1.15 the St. Paul's and Presentation Students met members of the **Marist Outreach**. The presentation from the GAP Team included a music video clip by Nickelback called "If everyone cared" as they presented their work with disadvantaged young people.

Br. Harry Prout who works with the Exodus Community in Melbourne and **Kerry Joyce** spoke to children about the life for the disadvantaged in Fitzroy.

Br. Doug Walsh spoke of his experiences in setting up schools for the children who did not

receive education or fit the mainstream schools. **Br. Tony Caddy** presented the life of Marcellin Champagnat and his relevance to students today.

St. Paul's at EXPO

14th August is a day with a difference. Classes will not run at St. Paul's. Instead Year 7 students and parents are encouraged to visit **EXPO**. Year 8 students will report to school as normal for Homeroom. They will then be transported to Presentation Campus for an introduction to Year 9, 2010. After a visit to EXPO they will then be picked up by the buses from Kildare Campus. Year 9 students are required to visit EXPO at Kildare Campus from 11.00 onwards, meet staff about subject selection and visit the external career providers present at EXPO.

St. Paul's SRC and 40 Hour Famine
