He sat with me in the Gallery on the day.*

Brittany was interviewed by the film crew making a promotional video for Youth Parliament to be distributed Statewide. We would like to thank Brittany for her fine representation of the College. Arrangements for Work Experience has closed for the September school holidays. Work Experience over the school holidays is one week only.

Due to new Legislation brought down from the Department of Education and Training Victoria on April 19th 2004 the changes regarding work experience are as follows:

Students working in areas deemed high-risk industries eg: Builders, Carpenters, Electricians, and Plumbers must abide by the Education (Workplace Learning Act 2003) Ministerial Orders 23 and 24.

The act states every student undertaking Work Experience in these areas must complete the Occupational Health & Safety Module before they proceed with a placement.

Students are not permitted to do the following:

- Operate powered machinery of any kind.
- Work at heights where there is any risk of fall.
- Handle hazardous substances (chemicals).
- Operate mobile platforms.
- Operate automated machines.

Students are able to observe employers and ask questions regarding the workplace. Students are able to take notes on how employers complete tasks.
