Course Selection

The process of subject selection for 2005 is in full swing at the moment, with workshops, conversations and discussions taking place on a regular basis.

Year 9 students have been visiting the Kildare Campus and looking at what the Campus has to offer. Many are discovering that there are several pathways that they can take to achieve their ultimate goals; whilst for others the process of thinking more seriously about their future is occurring, perhaps for the very first time. It is not a time to be overly anxious about future directions, however, if questions arise, please contact key personnel on the Campus to have them addressed.

Year 10's and 11's are also going through a process of subject selection and whilst they are more familiar than the Year 9's with choosing their courses of study, they too need to be careful to ensure that the relevant prerequisites are included if necessary. To do this they need to consult with staff, with VICTER Booklets and the

various supports in the Information Services Centre and the Careers Office.

Due Dates

This time is also administratively critical for us. It is most important that Enrolment Forms are returned by the dates prescribed. The College needs to make decisions about staffing, class sizes, how many classes will be offered and to begin the development of the 2005 timetable. With over 650 individually negotiated programs, this is an enormous task and we are held up if the subject enrolment information is not with us by the prescribed times listed below:
