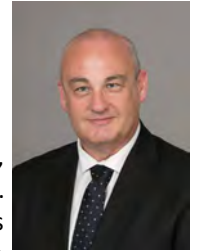

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From the Principal, Mr John Freeman Bishop Emeritus Jeremiah RIP



It is with sadness that I write that the former Bishop of Sale, Jeremiah Coffey, passed away in the early hours of Wednesday 19th November at the age of 81. Bishop Coffey was held in high regard throughout the Diocese. Bishop Coffey was born in Cork, Ireland, and came to Australia as a missionary priest to the Diocese of Sale soon after his ordination in 1958. As Father Coffey, he served in the parishes of Bairnsdale, Sale, Traralgon, Omeo, Iona and Yallourn prior to being appointed the first parish priest of Churchill and Rector of Corpus Christi Seminary, Clayton. Bishop Coffey served as Bishop of the Diocese of Sale from 1989 until his retirement in 2008.

Funeral arrangements are: Rosary will be recited at St Mary's Catholic Church, Bairnsdale at 5pm on Monday 1st December 2014 followed by Vigil Mass at 6pm. The funeral will then process to St Mary's Cathedral, Foster St, Sale for the Rite of Reception arriving at approximately 8.30pm. Prayers will follow until 11pm.

The Solemn Mass of Christian Burial will be celebrated at St. Mary's Cathedral, Foster Street, Sale on Tuesday, 2nd December at 11am.

The burial will take place immediately afterwards in the grounds of the Cathedral.

Also can I ask please ask that you remember Andrew Wald's father in law, Con Efandis, who passed away earlier this month.

Our thoughts and prayers are with Andrew and his family as well as those who were touched by the life of Bishop Emeritus Jeremiah Coffey.

In Joyful Expectation

Christmas is a time for coming together. Family members come home. Friends have parties. There is warmth of feelings. People share stories, their thoughts, themselves.

Jesus started it. During Advent we focus on his coming – his coming together with us. He came to be one of us, to share his story with us, and to make our story his. He came to be together with us. He wants to join us around the table and talk.

There is nothing difficult or strange about this. We have his words. He is still speaking them. The mystery is, when we share with one another our thoughts about his words, Jesus speaks through us. When we read his words and reflect on them, Jesus draws us together around the table of his love and shares his heart with us.

*The people walking in darkness have seen a great light;
on those living in the land of deep darkness a light has dawned.
(Isaiah 9: 2)*

There is an advantage to walking in the light, and it's rather simple. When walking in the light, we don't bump into things. We are infinitely less likely to stumble and fall. We can see where we're headed. We can avoid the things that block our way. Simply put, light gives us the winning edge over darkness.

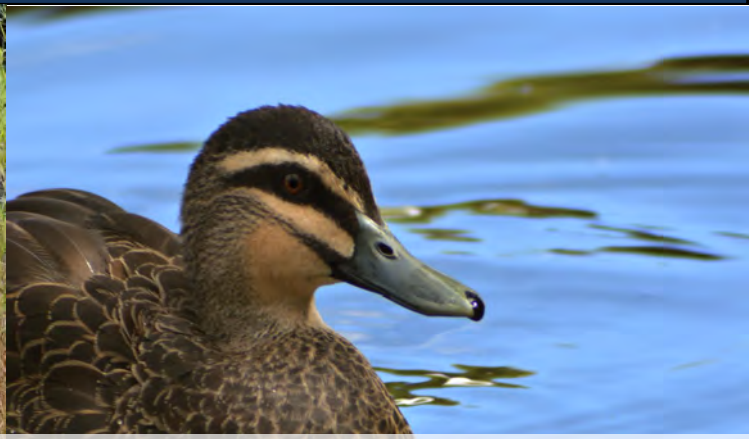

Healthy Hot Chips Recipe



People love hot chips! But did you know that 8 to 12 of commercially bought hot chips have around 3 teaspoons of fat and 1000 kJ. Compare this to a small baked potato with a light spray of oil which has less than 1/2 teaspoon of fat and 400 kJ. Here is a quick, easy and delicious way to make healthier hot chips that the whole family will enjoy.

Home Made Chunky Chips

Ingredients

- 2 large potatoes cut into chips or wedges with the skin on (use Red Rascal variety or other variety that is good for baking)
- 1 teaspoon of olive oil

Method

- Place a large tray or baking dish into the oven and pre-heat oven to 200°C.
- Place all ingredients into a small bowl and mix
- Take hot tray or baking dish from oven using an oven mitt, and empty potatoes onto the hot tray.
- Return to the oven to cook for about 15 minutes or until the potato is golden brown and cooked, then serve.

Oral Health

Maintaining good oral health is essential to overall health and wellbeing. Teenagers and Young Adults need to protect their mouths and teeth by practising good oral health hygiene.

Although regular brushing and flossing are important, the oral health of this age group is also often associated with risk factors such as diet, smoking and alcohol and mouth and tongue piercings.

The most common oral health disease in teenagers and young adults, is Tooth decay. Tooth decay is a diet related disease. It is caused by the interaction of sugar and plaque to produce acids. Acids dissolve the outer layer of the tooth. These acids are produced by bacteria in plaque which develops after eating sugars commonly found in food and over



Tips to maintain good oral health

- Brush teeth twice a day with fluoride toothpaste and a toothbrush that has small, compact head and soft bristles. When the bristles appear 'shaggy' it is time to change toothbrushes.
- Flossing once a day is recommended. There may be some bleeding at first but this should subside after a few days if tooth cleaning is thorough
- Limit sugars and processed foods to mealtimes (rather than between meals).
- Choose snacks such as cheese, natural yoghurt, fresh fruit and vegetables, dry biscuits, nuts and wholegrain bread.

- Wear a professionally fitted mouthguard when training and playing sport where there is risk of oral injury.
- Have regular oral health checkups - don't wait for a problem.
