# THE SPIRIT OF ASSISI

On 27th October, 1986, 160 religious leaders spent the day together at Assisi fasting and praying for world peace. They represented 32 Christian denominations and 11 non-Christian world traditions. Last Thursday was the 25th anniversary of this peace initiative and the Liturgical choir and some of the Young Marists from the St Paul's Campus supported an ecumenical prayer service at Christ Church, Anglican church in Drouin.

We joined other Gippslanders who gathered there to honour the call to peace in the world and in our hearts. A central part of this time for prayer was the declaration of what has come to be called The Assisi Decalogue, ten statements of belief proclaimed unanimously by the world's religious leaders at Assisi twenty five years ago. The Decalogue is really ten facets of the same desire for peace. Pope Paul VI said many years ago ... If you want peace work for justice.

I include the Decalogue here for you to ponder and make your own:

1. We commit ourselves to proclaiming our firm conviction that violence and terrorism are incompatible with the authentic spirit of religion, and, as we condemn every recourse to violence and war in the name of God or of religion, we commit ourselves to doing everything possible to eliminate the root causes of terrorism.
2. We commit ourselves to educating people to mutual respect and esteem, in order to help bring about a peaceful and fraternal coexistence between people of different ethnic groups, cultures and religions.
3. We commit ourselves to fostering the culture of dialogue, so that there will be an increase of understanding and mutual trust between individuals and among peoples, for these are the foundations of authentic peace.
4. We commit ourselves to defending the right of everyone to live a decent life in accordance with their own cultural identity, and to form freely a family of his or her own.
5. We commit ourselves to frank and patient dialogue, refusing to consider our differences as an insurmountable barrier, but recognizing instead that to encounter the diversity of others can become an opportunity for greater reciprocal understanding.
6. We commit ourselves to forgiving one another for past and present errors and prejudices, and to supporting one another in a common effort both to overcome selfishness and arrogance, hatred and violence, and to learn from the past that peace without justice is no true peace.
7. We commit ourselves to taking the side of the poor and the helpless, to speaking out for those who have no voice and to working effectively to change these situations, out of the conviction that no one can be happy alone.
8. We commit ourselves to taking up the cry of those who refuse to resort to violence and evil, and we desire to make every effort possible to offer the men and women of our time real hope for justice and peace.
9. We commit ourselves to encouraging all efforts to promote friendship between peoples, for we are convinced that, in the absence of solidarity and understanding between peoples, technological progress exposes the world to a growing risk of destruction and death.
10. We commit ourselves to urging leaders of nations to make every effort to create and consolidate, on the national and international levels, a world of solidarity and peace based on justice.

May we proclaim together what we believe and together live what we proclaim.

## **Examination & Head Start Program Year 10 – 12 Semester Two, 2011**

### **Examination Program**

Examinations are one of a number of assessment tasks that teachers of years 10 and 11 will use to determine the level of achievement of students. They also provide a valuable learning opportunity for our students who, in future years, will be challenged in examinations of different sorts as they pursue their pathways beyond secondary school.

Examination preparation requires students to organise, review, summarise and revise the subject matter. In addition to testing knowledge and understanding, examinations measure the quality of revision and time management before and during the examinations, and the ability to focus and answer the examination questions.

## EXAMINATION SCHEDULE

The Semester Two Examination Timetable for Year 10 and Year 11 students will be available on the College Website ([www.lavalla.vic.edu.au](http://www.lavalla.vic.edu.au)) and will be made available to all students via LA classes from Friday November 4th.

The Semester Two Examination Timetable for Year 12 (Unit 3/4 studies) is available on the VCAA website ([www.vcaa.vic.edu.au](http://www.vcaa.vic.edu.au)) and an individualised timetable has been distributed to all Unit 3/4 students.

All examinations will take place at the College and students are reminded that they must wear full school uniform (summer) to attend all examinations. An overview of examination rules and procedures for year 10 and 11 exams can be found on the College Website.
